7. Our Current Projects:

7.1. Local Right Program

- **Objective**: To promote social economic, welfare, and Leadership to children, women, farmers, and fisherfolk family through building community resilience and sustainable natural resource management.
- Working at 5 districts at Kampot and Kep provinces.
- Target Group: 17 Child Club(1700child), 60farmers, and 2 community fisheries.

- Project Programmatic:
- 1. <u>Child Sponsorship:</u> Messages collection for donors, child respondents, soft story, gift fun. Child new profiles.

2. <u>Child Club:</u> building capacity for 17 Child Club (1320child) training: local life skill such (reading improvement & hygiene), young leadership, child safe guarding policy.

3. **Agroecology:** Formed farmer group, Capacity building on Agriculture Techniques, Market Linkage/networking, Leadership skill, monitoring.

4. Natural Resource Management: Building Capacity for community on Fishery Law, Natural Management and protection, Mangrove Reforestation, DRR&CCA for women champion, Building the ecotourism service, established community fishery network both Kampot and Kep, and provide emergency case for children.

7.2. Women-led Alternative to Climate Change in Cambodia (WLACC)

- **Objective**: harness women's potential to effect change and build more community resilience and capacity to better manage disaster and climate related risks.
- Target Area: 5 Sangkats in Krong Kampot. Kampot Province.
- **Target group**: 33 women champion and 90 farmers of women vulnerable families.
- Project Programmatic:
- 1. Women Champion Network: Financial supports, capacity building on women right, genders, DRR&CCA, Leadership, proposal writing and planning, and provide small mitigation that led by women.

2. <u>Agroecology</u>: Building capacity on agriculture techniques, support materials, market linkage, women right and gender mainstreaming, and sharing the SHEA and Safeguarding to community.

7.3. **Empowering Young Leader (EYL)**

- **Objective**: Young people, especially young women, are empowered to participate effectively in civic engagement and develop and grow their own businesses.
- **Target Area:** 3 Sangkats in Krong Kep, Kep Province.
- **Target Group:** 139 Youth Club Network Members including 111females.
- **Project Programmatic:** Capacity building on leadership, business improvement, financial management, socio economic right, solid waste management, and working with local authority to improve the waste management, promote civic/youth engagement.

7.4. Strengthening MPAs, fisheries governance and coastal community livelihoods in Cambodia

- **Objective**: Protect marine biodiversity and strengthen resilience of coastal ecosystems and communities in Cambodia.
- **Target Area**: 3 Community fisheries in Kampot Province and 2 Community Fisheries in Kep Province.
- **Target Group:** 5 Community Fisheries member above.
- **Project Programmatic:** Support community on mangrove habitation, provide small enterprise, and capacity building on seafood value chain, MSME technical, and gender mainstreaming.

- 7.5. Securing access to and control over land and natural resources for vulnerable community fisheries in the coastal areas of Cambodia
 - **Objective**: promote equitable access to and control over land and natural resources for vulnerable groups in Cambodia.
 - Target Area: 8 Community Fisheries in Kampot province and 5 Community Fisheries, and 2 Community Fishery Networks in Kampot and Kep.

- **Target Group:** 14 Cfis members and 2-Fishery Networking and 45youths/25females.
- **Project Programmatic:** Support Cfis on capacity building on land law, fishery law, natural resource management, gender mainstreaming, communication and negotiation, leadership, proposal writing and planning, support subgrant, engage youth with Cfis for natural resource protection, mangrove restoration, update Cfis profile, support on youth on writing content, article and facebook posting, and Vlog, established Cfis network both Kampot and Kep, support Cfis on patrolling activity and natural resource protection, support Cfis on review structure and legal confirmed and approved by MAFF, and support Cfis network coordination meeting such as commune public forum for raising the problem/challenge to local government and provincial government. Round table dialogue between local authority FiA marine police and community fishery.

- 7.6. Greater Young Women Empowerment in Decision Making and Accountable Public Service Delivery
 - **Objective**: To maximize civic spaces particularly young women, to engage in dialogues with decision makers on social and economic policy development and implementation at national

- and local levels, and To improve government accountability, transparency, and better public services delivery, particularly Gender Responsive Public Services (GRPS) delivery in Cambodia
- Target Area: 4 communes/Teuk Chhu district
- **Target Group:** 37 Youth Club Members including 34 Females.
- **Project Programmatic:** Capacity building on public services, advocacy platform, youth dialogue and forum, leadership, gender, produce article and video, team building, support youth activity to organize youth dialogue, youth forum, produce article and video, charter of demand, consultative workshop with local authority to raise the needs and finding supporting.
